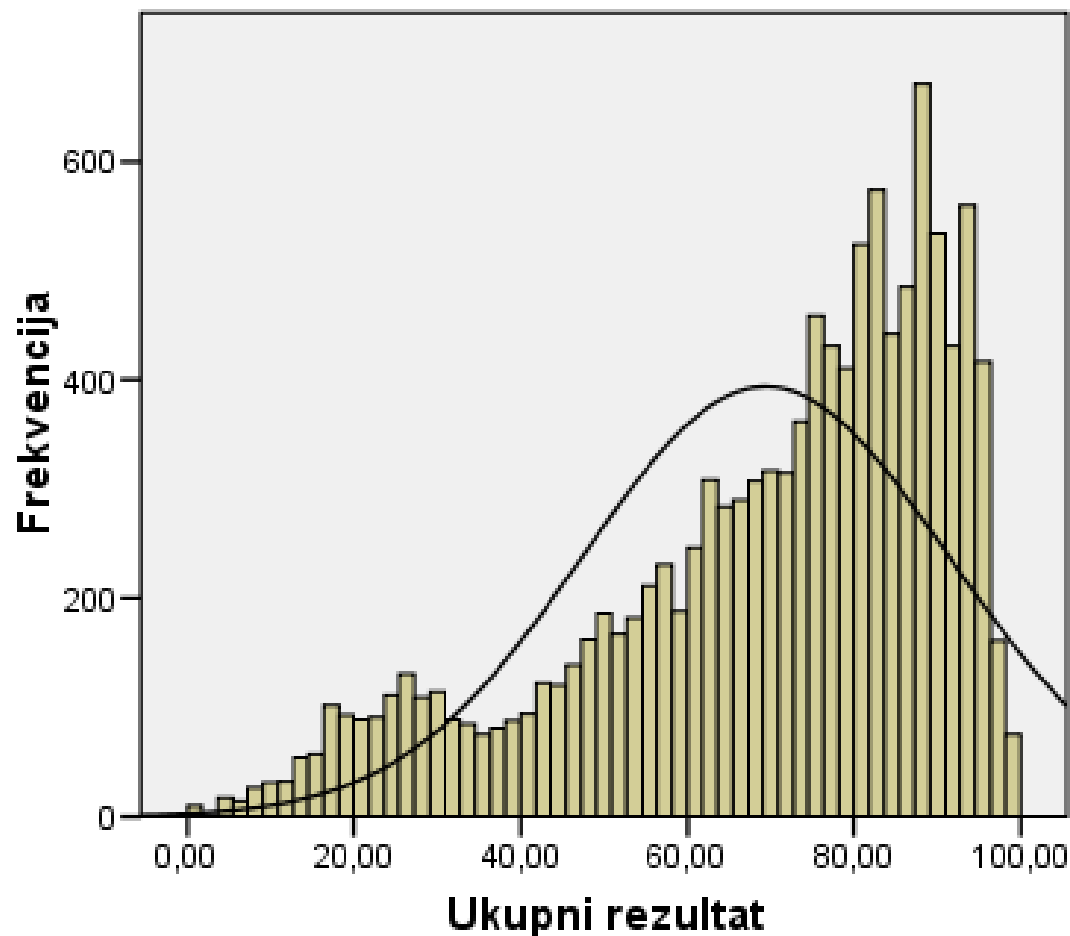

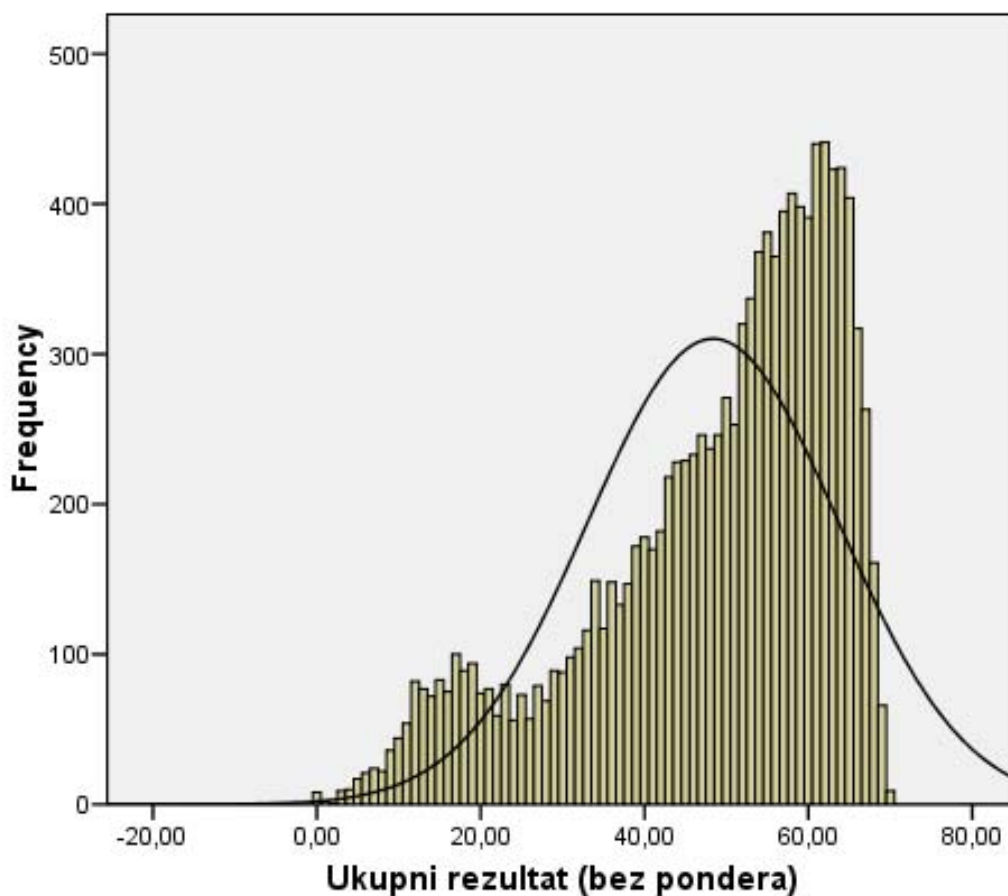

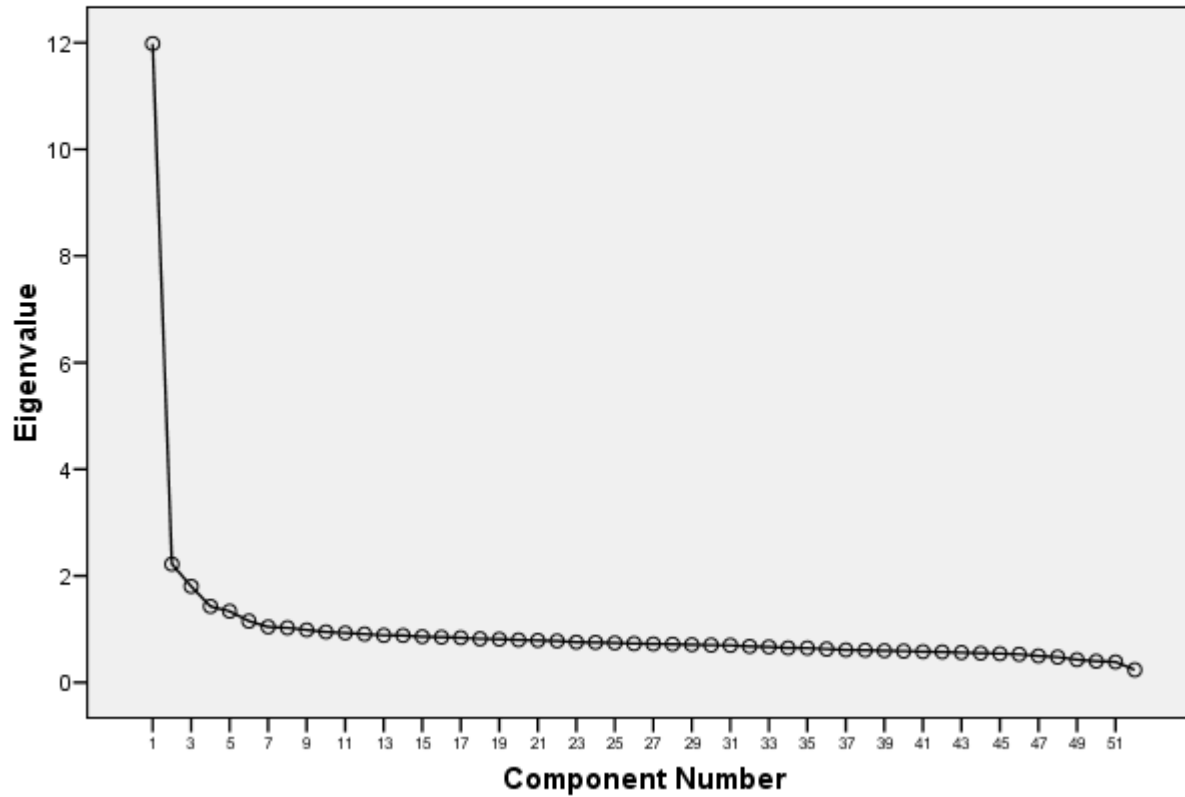

- 1 faktor, objašnjava 23% varijance

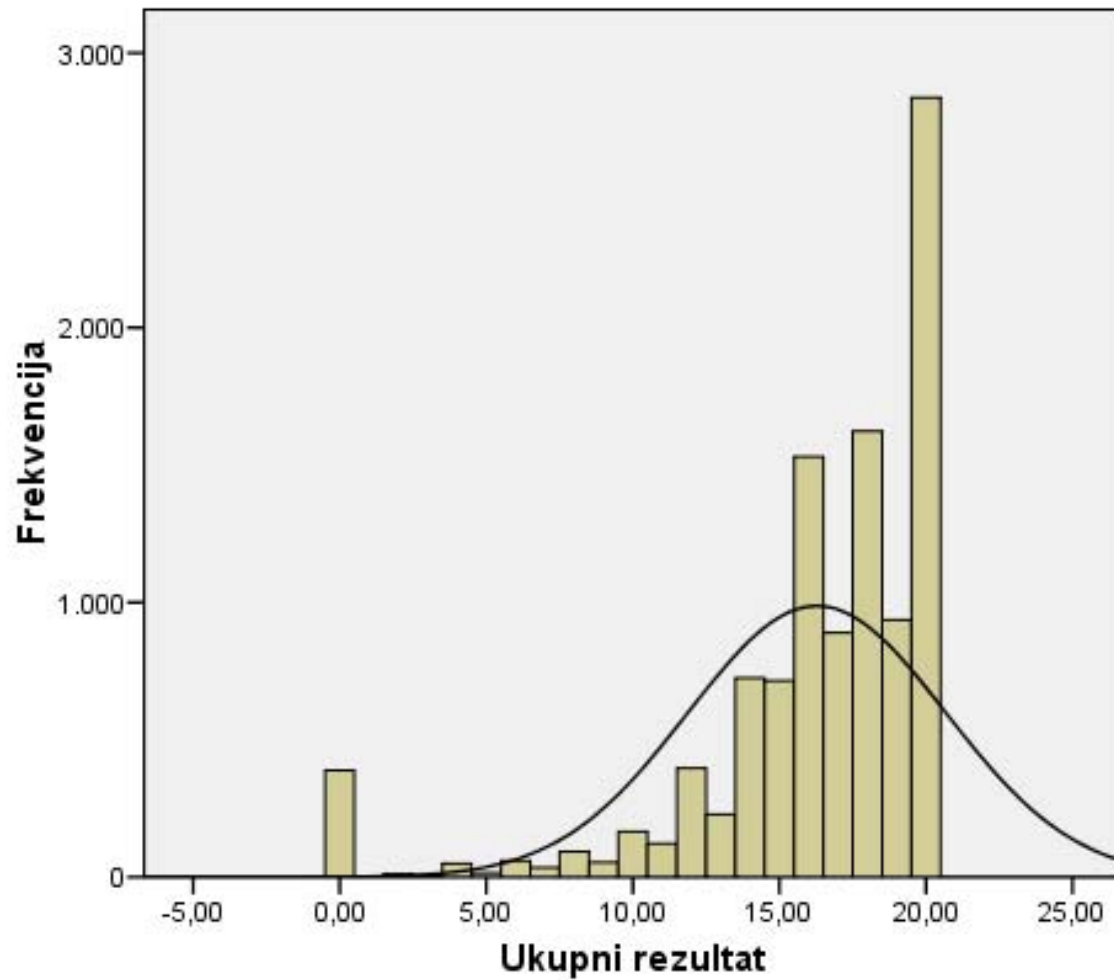
